





At the heart of the group are siblings Shannon, Solon, and Jeremiah who grew up playing Canadian folk music alongside their parents and among artists from around the world; a unique upbringing that led to a love and respect for all music. Gideon Freudmann, cellist and composer, has been on the forefront of that instrument's modern creative expansion for more than 30 years. In the early 1980s,



Gideon's formal education laid a solid classical foundation on which he built a diverse catalog of wide ranging musical genres. Gideon has lead several ensembles, building on his extended technique with real-time electronics. He loops and layers his sounds, sculpting orchestras out of thin air. He has taken this a step further with live accompaniments for classic silent films. He creates an astounding range of sounds and textures taking the cello into new sonic and stylistic territory. In the early 1990s, Gideon was asked to accompany a showing of Phantom of the Opera. Gideon has since expanded his film repertoire, performing a variety of German Expressionist films, and Buster Keaton comedies, as well as films by Hitchcock and Douglas Fairbanks Jr, at theaters throughout the USA. In conjunction with his silent film work, Gideon continues to compose music for solo cello and ensembles. He has recorded 25 CDs and contributed to soundtracks for numerous modern film and concert performances, and composed a catalog of sheet music for string ensembles. He is a founding member and composer for the Portland Cello Project, Whidbey Island String Trio, and Caravan Gogh.

Buckley's most recent album, "Frame by Frame," has been recognized through Canadian Folk Music Award and Western Canadian Music Award nominations, as well as a Calgary Music Award for best folk recording. Making a name as the biggest breakthrough artist on the international Americana scene with their debut album, *Go By Feel*, Canadian folk/country/roots collective, The Hello



Darlins, have returned with an even more ambitious collection of material for 2024: a double album titled *The Alders & The Ashes*. Led by Romani-Canadian musician, Candace Lacina, and world-renowned keyboardist, Mike Little, The Hello Darlins are some of Canada's most in-demand professional session & touring musicians who came together to forge a distinct hybrid of country, gospel, and blues. With millions of streams and 3 Canadian Folk Music Awards nominations, The Hello Darlins took the show on the road for 187 days in 2023, showing that the band sounds just as powerful on stage as it does in the studio. Referred to as a "ONE-BAND AMERICANA FESTIVAL," European audiences had the first chance to see them in late 2022 and early 2023 when the band showcased at UK Americana Music Week, along with performing for Canada Day in London's Trafalgar Square and a second tour of The Netherlands. From there, The Hello Darlins joined with their friend Matt Andersen for a 36-date, cross-Canada tour that marked their formal introduction to audiences in their home country. Playing sold out shows in revered venues such as Massey Hall (Toronto) to the National Arts Centre (Ottawa) the band proved they were truly ready for big stages by delivering a tight, uplifting show that highlighted the musical skills of each member.



He is a clinician for the Disney Imagination Campus Recording Workshop and has developed exciting school outreach programs guaranteed to inspire young talent. El Javi is a gifted North American guitarist who fearlessly explores instrumental music, transcending the confines of





heads." These two have been making music together since the moment they met in 2009. Their newest album, Losses, released April 21, 2023. Losses is their most personal record yet—full of real life grief, observation on the connectivity of all things, and the hope that comes through trials of fire. It was recorded in one heavenly, creative week at Dreamland Studio in Kingston, NY. Each tune was tracked live, and then more magic was added on top. Josh Kaufman (Bonny Light Horseman, The National, Anais Mitchell, Josh Ritter) produced this album and gave each song such tender loving care that your ears will be enthralled from the first note.

The Lucky Valentines have written upward of eighty songs, and use a mix of folk melodic sensibilities, tight harmonies, and a whole lotta love to make sad things beautiful. Their sound could be bottled up as "Bruce Springsteen and Patty Griffin meet Shovels and Rope in a Gypsy Junkshop." He sometimes uses a thirdhand suitcase as a kick drum, and the rotary phone from her father's shop as a mic. She blends classical violin with raging folk passion. He channels John Prine and Hank Williams. They have played hundreds of live shows together and have been featured on MTPR's Musician Spotlight, at Austin's Iconic Hole in the Wall Cafe, the street dance and side stage of Red Ants Pants Music Festival, and were featured on the May 2022 episode of MTPBS's award winning 11th and Grant with Erik Funk.




